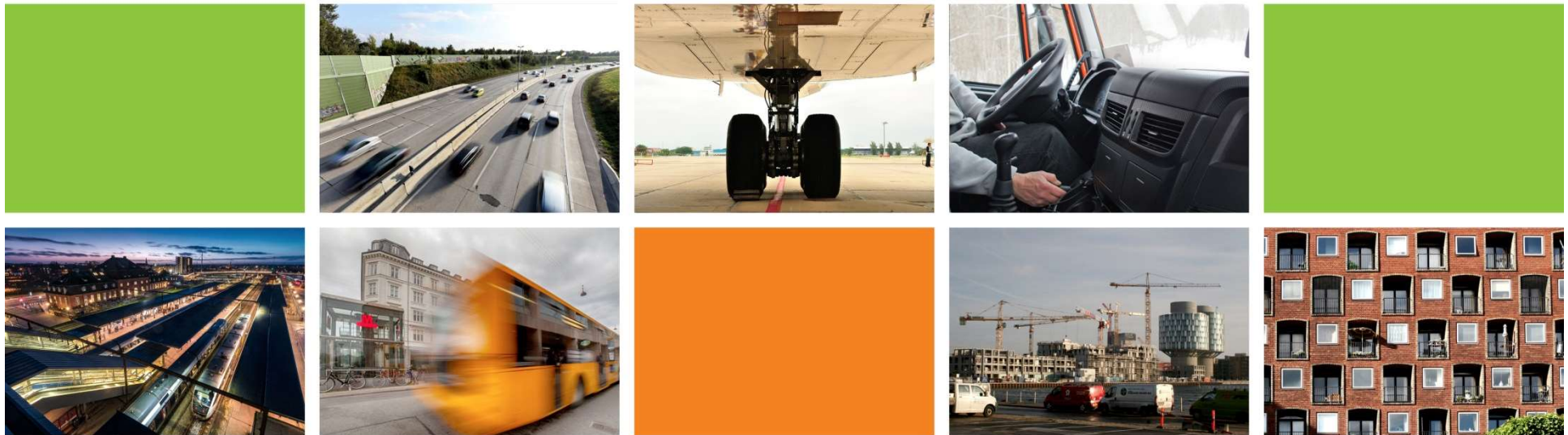


New guidance on Regulation 139

Background

- New Regulation 139 supersedes Danish regulation
- Differs from the former Danish regulation
 - More general (grass, reporting, wildlife consultant)
 - More detailed (education/training, risk assessments)
- Need for a common ground
- Requirement to prepare a national procedure and programme for registration and reporting of occurrences

The guidance

- Actual guidance (Ca. 14 pages)
 - Requirements for authorities and aerodromes
 - AMC
 - GM
- Appendices with more technical content

Main text

- Requirements for authority:
 - Monitoring of surroundings
 - National procedure for registration and reporting
 - Secure gathering of information from operators
 - Secure assessment of the risk of wild life strikes
 - Reporting to ICAO
- Requirements for aerodromes:
 - Risk assessment
 - Methods and procedures for reduction of risk
 - Notify authority if there is a significant risk

Main text – AMC and GM

- AMC
 - Participate in national programme
 - Implement procedures for gathering information and reporting
 - Establish wildlife risk management programme
- GM
 - Risk assessments
 - Wildlife risk management programme
 - Training of personnel
 - Registration and reporting
